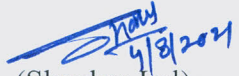

Reference is invited to this Office OM of even number dated 25th June, 2020 forwarding the Department of Expenditure (DoE) OM No. 12/17/2019-PPD dated 15th May, 2020 and 28th May, 2020 regarding Global Tender Enquiry (GTE) for information and compliance by CPSEs.

In continuation of the above reference, the undersigned is directed to forward a copy of the clarification issued by D/o Expenditure vide OM No.07/12/2021-PPD dated 27.07.2021 regarding the competent authority for approval for issuance of GTEs in respect of autonomous bodies/CPSEs, etc. selected by project executing agencies in Multilateral Development Banks (MDBs)/Bilateral Funding Agencies (BFAs) funded projects.
3. All the administrative Ministries/ Departments of CPSEs are requested to inform their CPSEs about the content of the DoE's OM dated 27.07.2021 for compliance.

Subject: Projects funded by Multilateral Development Banks(MDBs)/ Bilateral Funding Agencies(BFAs) – applicability of procurement guidelines.

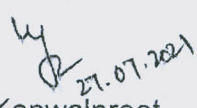
Currently many prestigious projects are being funded by the Multilateral Development Banks (MDBs)/ Bilateral Funding Agencies(BFAs). Such funds play an important role in the overall budgeting & funding of infrastructure. The procurement by executing agencies in such projects is governed by the conditions negotiated in the loan agreement. Usually such loan agreements specify that the procurements by the executing agencies shall be governed by the guidelines of the respective agencies. Cost effective execution of such projects is essential to ensure full utilization of available funds amidst fiscal constraints.

2. This Department vide OM No. F. No. 12/17/2019-PPD dated 15.05.2020 and 28.05.2020, amending Rule 161 (iv) of General Financial Rules (GFRs), 2017 had instructed that no Global Tender Enquiry (GTE) shall be invited for tenders up to Rs 200 crore. In exceptional cases, where the Ministry or Department feels that there are special reasons for GTE, it may record its detailed justification and seek prior approval for relaxation to the above rule from the Competent Authority i.e. Secretary (Coordination), Cabinet Secretariat.

3. Project executing agencies from time to time further award works to various Autonomous Bodies (ABs)/ Central Public Sector Enterprises (CPSEs) etc. as their contractors in the projects funded by MDBs/ BFAs. A doubt has arisen if this Department's instructions regarding GTEs as above will be applicable to such bodies/ enterprises selected by Project executing agencies in MDB/ BFA funded projects.

4. Considering all the factors and special circumstances, it is hereby notified that the Secretary of the Ministry/ Department responsible for execution of such projects shall be the Competent Authority for approval for issuance of GTEs by such Autonomous Bodies/ CPSEs etc.

5. This issues with the approval of Finance Secretary.
